ORCA Communications awarded wiring project for Bureau of Indian Affairs site in North Carolina

North Bend, Ore. – ORCA Communications will travel to Cherokee, N.C. to install inside data and voice cabling in a Bureau of Indian Affairs facility under a federal contract awarded today.

This Indian-owned company set aside contract is valued at more than \$48,000. Work includes the installation, termination and testing of low voltage CAT 6 cabling. The project also includes a fiber run, cabinet installation and the removal of abandoned cables.

“This project allows our team to see a project from start to finish using only our own resources,” ORCA President Karl Kennedy said. “It is an opportunity for a tribally-owned company to do a job for the BIA and add to ORCA’s performance history.”

Kennedy said the BIA project is ORCA’s fifth federal contract award since the company achieved SBA 8(a) status at the end of 2013.
